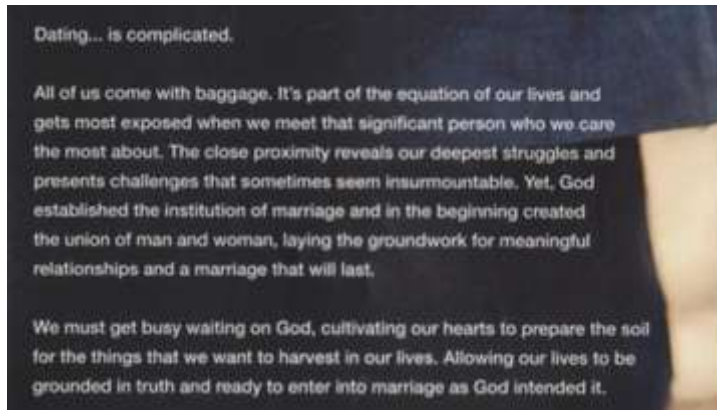

Basic points of “boymeetsgirl” by Pastor Louie Giglio:

- You are a fortress of Godly value, he/she cannot trump your value.
- Men: A gap is needed between living with mom and leading (not ruling) a women on a life long spiritual journey. A man needs time to stabilize both mentally and financially.
- Before any boy meets any girl, you must first fall in love with Jesus.
- The second goal is to find that special someone that also fell in love with Jesus. Now your potential is realized when you both love Jesus. This is how marriage works.
- Every relationship is either pulling together or drifting apart from God.
- We can spend our earthy days either embracing or erasing God’s plan for us.
- Cleaving before leaving is not part of God’s plan.
- The operative words in Psalm 37 are trust, dwell, delight, wait, be still, and commit. Note that waiting on God is an active thing.
- Start connecting the dots between who you are presently and who you want to be.
- Waiting on God for a spouse is not like sitting in a LazyBoy Chair and simply waiting.
- You have to be engaging in things that are loving and good – so that you connect the dots. Camp out in the truth. Dwell in the land and enjoy the safe pasture. Feed off the land of the fruit of God.
- Start the day with these foundational truths in your “drawer of brokenness”: I am loved. My Heavenly father is perfect. I am first loved. By his wounds, we are healed.
- Waiting on God is an active thing and camp out is the ways of truth. Get busy waiting on God.
- No one succeeds in defeating God’s plan and the foundation of Godly truth. Understanding this is basis of wisdom.
- There is no such thing as instantaneous maturity. If you do not think that you are the person that you want to marry, you cannot get the other person to compensate for this deficit.
- Marriage is awesome, but it is not magical. For example, It will not fix bad money management.
- Part of cultivating faithfulness is asking God, from your perspective, what do you see?
